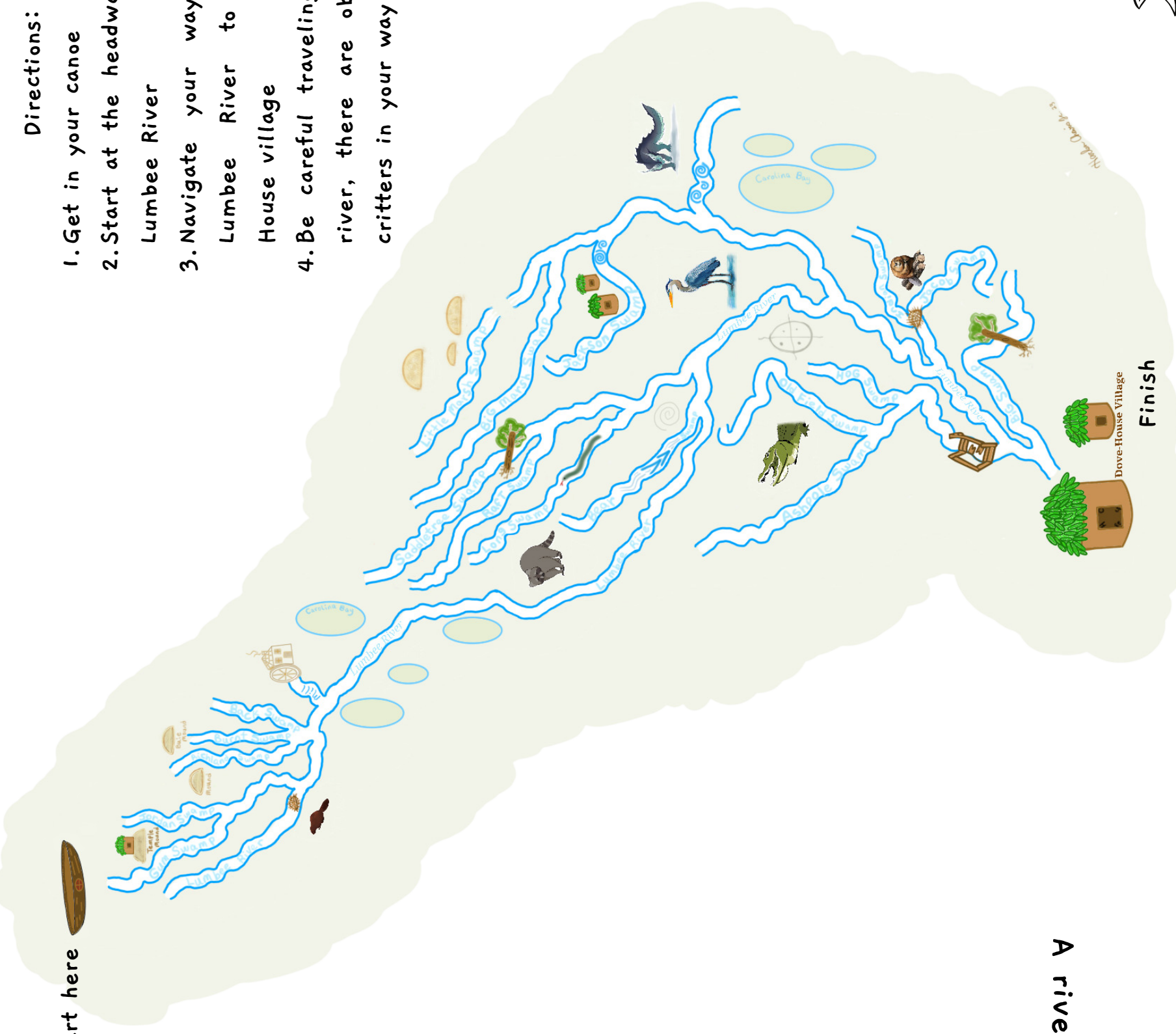


# LUMBEE RIVER FACTS

- A river is a stream of water flowing to the sea.
- Lumbee people get our name from the river.
- The Lumbee River starts on the Moore/Scotland county line and it ends in South Carolina where it meets the Little Pee Dee River.
- The Lumbee River is also known as Drowning Creek.
- The Lumbee River is 133 miles long.
- There are 19 swamps that flow into the Lumbee River.
- The Lumbee River water is black because of the leaves that fall into the water and the cypress tree roots that grow in the river bed which gives the water the dark and murky color.
- Indian people have lived along the Lumbee River for thousands of years.
- Lumbee people still live along the river today
